Genesis 41:46

Joseph was thirty years old when he entered
the service of Pharaoh king of Egypt.

Numbers 4:2-3

Take a census of the sons of Kohath
from among the sons of Levi,
by their clans and their fathers' houses,
from thirty years old up to fifty years old,
all who can come on duty,
to do the work in the tent of meeting.

Numbers 8:24-26

This applies to the Levites:
from twenty-five years old and upward
they shall come to do duty
in the service of the tent of meeting.

And from the age of fifty years
they shall withdraw from the duty
of the service and serve no more.

They minister to their brothers

but they shall do no service.
