


Galatians 5:1

## Anger:


A strong feeling of annoyance,

Matthew 5:21-22

“You have heard that it was said to those of old,  
‘You shall not murder; and whoever murders  
will be liable to judgment.’

“But I say to you that everyone who is angry  
with his brother will be liable to judgment;  
whoever insults his brother  
will be liable to the council;  
and whoever says, ‘You fool!’  
will be liable to the hell of fire.”

Genesis 4:1-7

Now Adam knew Eve his wife,  
and she conceived and bore Cain, saying,  
“I have gotten a man with the help of the LORD.”

And again, she bore his brother Abel.

Now Abel was a keeper of sheep,  
and Cain a worker of the ground.

A patter of “quick to anger”

Dangerous like a bomb

Antidote: “Be angry, and do not sin”

RESIST!

# RESENTMENT

A pattern of “slow to forgive”

Passive aggressive behavior; cultivated bitterness

Dangerous like poison

Antidote: “Do not let the sun go down on your anger”

REPENT!

Galatians 5:19-23

Now the works of the flesh are evident:  
sexual immorality, impurity, sensuality,  
idolatry, sorcery, enmity, strife, jealousy,  
fits of anger, rivalries, dissensions, divisions,  
envy, drunkenness, orgies, and things like these.

I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do  
such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience,  
kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-  
control; against such things there is no law.

Galatians 5:19-23

Now the works of the flesh are evident:

and things like these.

I warn you, as I warned you before, that those who do

But the fruit of the Spirit is ...  
self-control.

A patter of “quick to anger”

# RESENTMENT

A pattern of “slow to forgive”

Passive aggressive behavior; cultivated bitterness

Dangerous like poison

Antidote: “Do not let the sun go down on your anger”

REPENT!

Ephesians 4:26-27

Be angry and do not sin;  
do not let the sun go down on your anger,  
and give no opportunity to the devil.

Ephesians 4:30-32

And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God,  
by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

Let all bitterness and wrath and anger  
and clamor and slander be put away from you,  
along with all malice.

forgiving one another,  
as God in Christ forgave you.
