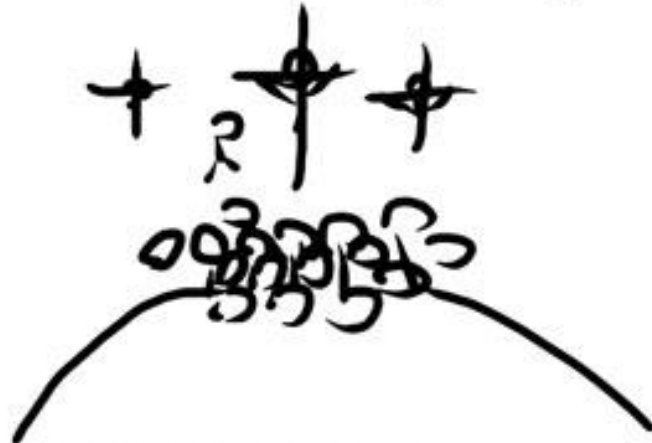
But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead,

Christ was killed publicly



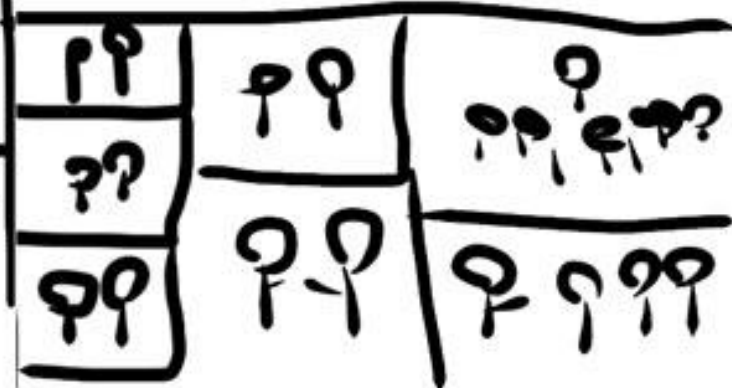
Christ rose from a public
