heard of it (for he was in Egypt,
where he had fled from King Solomon),
then Jeroboam returned from Egypt.

2 Chronicles 10:3-4

And they sent and called him.

And Jeroboam and all Israel
came and said to Rehoboam:

“Your father made our yoke heavy.
Now therefore lighten the hard service
of your father and his heavy yoke on us,
and we will serve you.”

2 Chronicles 10:5

He said to them,
“Come to me again in three days.”

So the people went away.

2 Chronicles 10:6-7

Then King Rehoboam took counsel
with the old men, who had stood before
Solomon his father while he was yet alive, saying,
“How do you advise me to answer this people?”

And they said to him,
“If you will be good to this people
and please them and speak good words to them,
then they will be your servants forever.”

2 Chronicles 10:8-9

But he abandoned the counsel
that the old men gave him,
and took counsel with the young men
who had grown up with him
and stood before him.

And he said to them,
“What do you advise that we answer

And the young men who had grown up with him said to him, “Thus shall you speak to the people who said to you, ‘Your father made our yoke heavy, but you lighten it for us’; thus shall you say to them:

“My little finger is thicker than my father’s thighs. And now, whereas my father laid on you a heavy yoke, I will add to your yoke. My father disciplined you with whips, but I will discipline you with scorpions.”

And the king answered them harshly; and forsaking the counsel of the old men, King Rehoboam spoke to them according to the counsel of the young men, saying, “My father made your yoke heavy, but I will add to it. My father disciplined you with whips, but I will discipline you with scorpions.”

Then King Rehoboam sent Hadoram,
who was taskmaster over the forced labor,
and the people of Israel stoned him to death
with stones.

And King Rehoboam quickly mounted his chariot
to flee to Jerusalem.

So Israel has been in rebellion against
the house of David to this day.

When Rehoboam came to Jerusalem,
he assembled the house of Judah and Benjamin,
180,000 chosen warriors,
to fight against Israel,
to restore the kingdom to Rehoboam.

2 Chronicles 11:2-4

But the word of the LORD came to Shemaiah the man of God:

“Say to Rehoboam the son of Solomon, king of Judah, and to all Israel in Judah and Benjamin: ‘Thus says the LORD, You shall not go up or fight against your relatives. Return every man to his home, for this thing is from me.’”

So they listened to the word of the LORD and returned and did not go against Jeroboam.

2 Chronicles 11:5-12

Rehoboam lived in Jerusalem,
and he built cities for defense in Judah.
He built Bethlehem, Etam, Tekoa, Beth-zur, Soco,
Adullam, Gath, Mareshah, Ziph, Adoraim, Lachish,
Azekah, Zorah, Aijalon, and Hebron,
fortified cities that are in Judah and in Benjamin.
He made the fortresses strong,
and put commanders in them,
and stores of food, oil, and wine.
And he put shields and spears in all the cities
and made them very strong.
So he held Judah and Benjamin.

2 Chronicles 11:13-15

And the priests and the Levites who were in all Israel presented themselves to him from all places where they lived.

For the Levites left their common lands and their holdings and came to Judah and Jerusalem, because Jeroboam and his sons cast them out from serving as priests of the LORD, and he appointed his own priests for the high places and for the goat idols and for the calves that he had made.

of Judah and came as far as Jerusalem.

Then the princes of Israel and the king humbled themselves and said, “The LORD is righteous.”

When the LORD saw that

and my wrath shall not be poured out
on Jerusalem by the hand of Shishak.”

2 Chronicles 12:8

“Nevertheless, they shall be servants to him,
that they may know my service
and the service of the kingdoms
of the countries.”

2 Chronicles 12:9a

So Shishak king of Egypt
came up against Jerusalem.
He took away the treasures
of the house of the LORD
and the treasures of the king's house.
He took away everything.

2 Chronicles 12:9b-11

He also took away the shields of gold
that Solomon had made,
and King Rehoboam made in their place
shields of bronze and committed them
to the hands of the officers of the guard,
who kept the door of the king's house.

And as often as the king went
into the house of the LORD,
the guard came and carried them
and brought them back to the guardroom.

2 Chronicles 12:12

And when he humbled himself
the wrath of the LORD turned from him,
so as not to make a complete destruction.
Moreover, conditions were good in Judah.

2 Chronicles 12:13

So King Rehoboam grew strong in Jerusalem and reigned.

Rehoboam was forty-one years old when he began to reign, and he reigned seventeen years in Jerusalem, the city that the LORD had chosen out of all the tribes of Israel to put his name there.

His mother's name was Naamah the Ammonite.
