1. There is an evil spirit, the enemy of God, and of all righteousness, who seeks continually to deceive, distress, and destroy us, i.e., Satan.
2. God permitted Job to be tried, as he suffered Peter to be sifted, by Satan.
3. Satan has no power to lead us astray, but what we give him ourselves; nor any power to afflict us but what is given from above.
4. God directs the affairs of the world.
