## THE SERVICE OF NINE LESSONS AND CAROLS

### First Lesson

Genesis 3:8-15

*God announces in the Garden of Eden that the seed  
of the woman shall crush the serpent's head.*

And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden.

**Fifth Lesson**

Luke 1:26-28

*The angel Gabriel salutes the virgin Mary.*

In the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God to a city of Galilee named Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man whose name was Joseph, of the house of David. And the virgin's name was Mary. And he came to her and said, "Greetings, O favored one, the Lord is with you!" But she was greatly troubled at the saying, and tried to discern what sort of greeting this might be.

But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will be with child and give birth to a son, and you shall call his name Jesus. And Mary said to the angel, "How will this be, since I am a virgin?"

## Sixth Lesson

Matthew 1:18-23

*Matthew tells of the birth of Jesus.*

Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way.

When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly.

Luke 2:8-16

Matthew 2:1-11

*The wise men are led by the star to Jesus.*

Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, “Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him.”

When Herod the king heard this, he was troubled, and all Jerusalem with him; and assembling all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born.

They told him, “In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it is written by the prophet:

“And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.”

Then Herod summoned the wise men secretly and ascertained from them what time the star had appeared. And he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, “Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word, that I too may come and worship him.”

After listening to the king, they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy.

And going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshiped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts: gold and frankincense and myrrh.

**Ninth Lesson**

John 1:1-14

*John unfolds the great mystery of the incarnation.*

In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
